Why Advanced Placement?


- AP forms a strong foundation for students moving into post-secondary
- Many post-secondary institutions offer credit for AP courses taken in high school this is done after an evaluation by the university registrar's office
- Scores of 4 or 5 will earn the credit
- RTHS alumni report that AP was instrumental in their success at university. They felt exceptionally prepared for the requirements of higher education
- Specifically, AP provided them with a significant background in research, which allowed them to flourish in the independent inquiry projects required in higher level Engineering, Science, Mathematics and Computer Science programs



Universities typically look for five 30 level academic courses or admission, including **ELA 30-1**

You must research the admission requirements for the institution you are applying to, as they are not standardized. For example, UBC recommends 6 academic courses. Some Universities will accept CTS classes as an approved course and some will not.
